WRD/PW REPORT BY BRANDON MILLS DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC WORKS Public Works cleaned up the leaves in the median at Plantation Drive that we are responsible for cleaning up. We do this annually after all the leaves have fallen. Several storm water drainage pipes were cleaned at the invert of the pipe. This helps with the flow of storm water through these pipes. Rain events are the perfect time to ride around and note issues throughout the system, to schedule repairs. In

addition, several storm water pipes were cleaned out with the town's water jet to remove blockages.

Water Resources has continued to do a good job at operating the town's water and wastewater systems. From the daily monitoring and testing, to weekly generator testing and lift station checks. Our team does a great job, and I would like to thank them for a job well done. A couple water service line leaks were repaired in January by our staff. Both leaks were located near or at the water meter box. We also had two collection system lateral blockages. Both were cleared with the town's water jet.

After-Hours water and sewer emergencies can be reported by dialing the Town Hall at 638-3870. You will be instructed to the dial "9" and follow the directions to contact the on call duty operator. Please be patient and our utility systems operator will return your call. If you do not receive a call back within ten minutes, please notify the Police Department at 638- 1108, and they will get in contact with the on-call utility systems operator.

- Dial "9" and follow the directions to contact the on-call duty operator.
- Enter your phone number at the sound of the tone.
- The automated system will inform you that your page has been sent.

- If you do not receive a call back within ten minutes, please notify the Police Department at 638-1108. They will get in touch with the on-call utility system operator.

Golf Cart Registration

Town ordinances allow for residents to drive their properly equipped golf carts on River Bend streets provided that they are inspected by and registered with our Police Department. If you plan to drive your golf cart on the roadways, you must display the current year registration decal. Decals for 2023 are available now.

Inspection and registration are required annually. The registration fee for each golf cart is \$10.

River Bend Animal Registrations for 2023 are due by March 31, 2023. All River Bend dogs and cats must be registered annually.

Office hours are Monday-Friday, 8 AM-4 PM.

DOG PARK AT RIVER BEND



River Bend dogs have their own exercise area where they can play with other canines. Situated between the Town Park and Ritter Field, the dog park gives dogs a chance to run while their owners socialize.

The park is open from sunrise to sunset for dogs with proof of current vaccinations. Separate exercise areas accommodate large and small dogs.
