





THE RIVER BEND STAFF AND POST HURRICANE FLORENCE RESPONSE BY MAYOR JOHN KIRKLAND

Those of us who call River Bend home should reflect on the dedication of the Town staff during the stressful period following Hurricane Florence. Since September 15 the staff, led by Manager Delane Jackson, has performed all regular duties and also the work associated with storm recovery.

It is most appropriate to specifically mention Allison McCollum, the Town's Certified Floodplain Administrator. Allison and her family do not live in River Bend, but they also are dealing with a home that

flooded during the hurricane. She is the staff member who interfaces with all residents who have experienced flooded homes and need to file with FEMA. I mention Allison only because she has met with so many residents with extreme damage in their homes.

Every member of the Town Staff has worked to solve unusual issues created by the hurricane with the goal of returning to conditions considered as normal. They all deserve a special expression of thanks. This staff would be a strong performing addition to any organization, and River Bend is fortu-

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nate that they have opted to serve our community. The staff has made every reasonable effort to keep citizens informed of the hurricane threat, the plans and work associated with recovery and the details of the Town's interaction with the FEMA staff as they assist in this effort.

There is another group of individuals deserving special recognition: the members of other North Carolina municipalities who have come to assist in the collection and

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transport to the landfill the mountains of construction debris created by the flooding. Manager Jackson placed a request to the state mutual aid pool for assistance in debris removal. This is an organization in which River Bend holds membership. Six municipalities sent equipment and personnel. One of the first to respond was the

City of Apex where former River Bend Manager Drew Havens is now manager. Winterville, Holly Springs, Carrboro, Concord and Mooresville also sent crews.

Town Manager Delane Jackson has received continuing support from the Craven County Emergency Management team. This professional team serves River Bend and the entire Craven

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County population in an impressive manner both before and following an event like hurricane Florence.

An objective review of the action of local, state and federal organizations in post Florence response will conclude that all performed quite well and each rose to the challenges presented and cooperated in achieving good management of the emergency presented by the hurricane.

Golf Cart Registration

Town ordinances allow for residents to drive their properly equipped golf carts on River Bend streets provided that they are inspected by and registered with our Police Department. If you plan to drive your golf cart on the roadways, you must display the 2018 registration decal.

Inspection and registration are required annually. The registration fee for each golf cart is \$10.

Registration is Required for all Dogs and Cats

All River Bend dogs and cats must be registered annually.

Office hours are Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. through 4:00 p.m. Registration is \$10.00 per pet.

Owners must present proof of rabies vaccination at the time of registration.



Pet I. D. Photos Now Available

The Town of River Bend is now offering residents the opportunity to link a digital photo of their registered pets to our Animal Registration database. When you register your pet this year, you may submit a photo by e-mail, or staff can scan a photo for you if you prefer. This photo database will help reunite lost pets with their owners more quickly in the event a pet becomes lost.

The service is voluntary and free of charge.

## DOG PARK AT RIVER BEND



River Bend dogs have their own exercise area where they can play with other canines. Situated between the Town Park and Ritter Field, the dog park gives dogs a chance to run while their owners socialize.

The park is open from sunrise to sunset for dogs with proof of current vaccinations. Separate exercise areas accommodate large and small dogs.
