A LOOK AT RIVER BEND'S FORM OF GOVERNANCE BY MAYOR JOHN KIRKLAND

Some background on the author of this article on the form and functioning of our Town's government during the years since 1997. I have served as an elected member of the Town's Governing Body since 1997. In 1999 the Town Council in opted to petition the General Assembly to amend the Town's Charter to govern under the Council/Manager form of government. In the years since this change was approved by the General Assembly, the Town has been served by

four Managers. Our current Manager, Delane Jackson, has served us for six years. I chose the subject of this month's article because we are working through the

recovery from the challenging work associated with the Coronavirus.

It has been my pleasure to have served with each of the four managers. They have all been solid professionals. It is fair to say that River Bend has benefitted greatly from the change of governance authorized by the General Assembly in the change to the Town's Charter. every day and has close contact with other managers and with staff at the UNC School of Government and the League of Municipalities. These contacts allow the manager to be very current in developments coming from the state regulatory agencies and the impact of actions by the General Assembly. Perhaps, most important is being alert to rapidly changing grant programs. Such as was the case following the destruction from Hurricane Florence. Under the Mayor/Council form of governance no member of the elected body would have the similar personal contacts to be current in rapidly changing regulatory issues that are time sensitive and directly impact the Town. Two other benefits of the Council Manager form are the management and supervision of Town staff and the orderly development of the annual budget. Having served on our Town's Council and as Mayor, I can attest that our current form of government is superior to what proceeded it. This statement is true during normal operations. It has become especially clear during emergencies, like Coronavirus and the Hurricane Florence, and the recovery phase following those emergencies.

From the UNC School of Government data on state-wide municipal government types, the following numbers are indicated for the River Bend peer group of populations of 2,500 – 5, 000. Number of municipalities in peer group 90; number with Mayor/Council form of government - 26; number with Council/Manager - 64. These numbers support the preference that has led the majority of peer municipalities to operate under charters that specify the Council/Manager form of government.

I complement the members of the Council that initiated the change in 1997 and all Council members in the interim years who have worked to strengthen this form of government for River Bend.

Golf Cart Registration

Town ordinances allow for residents to drive their properly equipped golf carts on River Bend streets provided that they are inspected by and registered with our Police Department. If you plan to drive your golf cart on the roadways, you must display the 2020 registration decal. Decals for 2020 were available beginning December 2, 2019.

Inspection and registration are required annually. The registration fee for each golf cart is \$10.

Registration is Required for all Dogs and Cats

All River Bend dogs and cats must be registered annually.

Office hours are Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. through 4:00 p.m. Registration is \$10.00 per pet.

Owners must present proof of rabies vaccination at the time of registration.



Pet I. D. Photos Now Available

The Town of River Bend is now offering residents the opportunity to link a digital photo of their registered pets to our Animal Registration database. When you register your pet this year, you may submit a photo by e-mail, or staff can scan a photo for you if you prefer. This photo database will help reunite lost pets with their owners more quickly in the event a pet becomes lost.

The service is voluntary and free of charge.

DOG PARK AT RIVER BEND



River Bend dogs have their own exercise area where they can play with other canines. Situated between the Town Park and Ritter Field, the dog park gives dogs a chance to run while their owners socialize.

The park is open from sunrise to sunset for dogs with proof of current vaccinations. Separate exercise areas accommodate large and small dogs.
