



**THE TOWN OF RIVER BEND'S CHARTER AND COMPLIANCE**

The Towns and Cities in North Carolina are chartered by Act of the General Assembly. A Google search for “municipal government in North Carolina” results in the following: “In North Carolina, cities, towns and villages are incorporated municipalities which means that the North Carolina General Assembly (or, in a few cases, a former state agency known as the Municipal Board of Control) has granted a charter authorizing the establishment of a municipal corporation (government) and outlining the powers, authority and responsibilities of the municipal government. Some of these are specified in the charter and some are authorized by state statutes.” (NCLM, How NC Cities Work)

The Town Charter is printed on the Town’s web page and runs for nine pages. The charter is complete with the January 14, 1981, charter and the several amendments that the General Assembly has authorized in the years since 1981. (Rather than print the document here it is requested that citizens read the Charter on the web page.)

The Town Council, Manager and staff must comply with the direction of the Town’s Charter, the laws of the State of North Carolina and the laws of the Federal Government. It is apparent that the day-to-day operation of municipal government in North Carolina does not operate by whim, but by direction from the General Assembly and the Federal Congress.

The River Bend Town Council, Manager and Staff has done very well in complying with these mandates.

## **TOWN MANAGER'S REPORT**

The Atlantic Hurricane season runs from June 1 through November 30 each year. However, a hurricane can form outside of those dates. Historically, fall is the most active part of hurricane season. September is the busiest month for hurricanes. According to the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), from 1851 to 2022, there were 709 tropical storms in the Atlantic. 63 of those became U.S. land falling hurricanes. The next busiest month was August with 439 and 44 respectively. During that same time frame, there were 122 tropical storms in November, with 2 becoming U.S. land falling hurricanes. We are in the heart of Hurricane Season.

Our proximity to the Atlantic coast, combined with the low elevation above sea level for large parts of our town, make River Bend vulnerable to impacts from Hurricanes. A tropical system does not need to develop into a hurricane to cause damage in River Bend, particularly in the special flood hazard area (SFHA), commonly called the “flood zone.”

Because of these facts, if you live in River Bend, you should consider purchasing flood insurance. You can obtain a policy from a local agent, through the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP). The Town of River Bend is a participant in the Community Rating System (CRS) of the NFIP. In short, that means that the town maintains records and files on flood zone properties, has and enforces a local flood damage prevention ordinance and meets other annual minimums to be a CRS town. Our CRS status means that River Bend residents who live in the SFHA are eligible for a 10% discount on annual flood insurance policy premiums.

Our records indicate that 503 homes in River Bend were flooded during Hurricane Florence, which made landfall on September 14, 2018. According to data from the NFIP, just before Hurricane Florence made landfall, there were 443 flood insurance policies in effect in River Bend. That means there were at least 60 flooded homes that did not have flood insurance.

Today, there are 448 flood insurance policies in effect in River Bend. That is an increase of 5 policies in 5 years since 2018. Today, there are 488 homes located in the SFHA in River Bend. That is a 92% coverage rate, which is very good. But there are still 40 homes that are not covered. It is important to note that being located

outside of a SFHA on the map does not mean that your home is safe from flooding. It just means that the risk of flooding is lower. On a personal note, my home is not located in a SFHA, but it is close. I can see the SFHA from my front porch. Just to be safe, I maintain flood insurance.

Of the currently insured homes in River Bend, cumulatively, those policies have total annual premiums of \$374,480 and are insured for a total \$118,274,000. On average, each policy owner pays \$835 in annual premium and is insured for \$264,000. Typically, regular home owners insurance does not cover damages from rising waters (flooding). If you are uncertain about your insurance coverage, you should contact your agent now. Do not wait until after the storm to learn that you are not covered.

It is true that flood insurance is like most other types of insurance, in that there may be many years that you pay the premium and never have a claim. Based on the figures above, a \$264,000 claim in River Bend would pay for 316 years' worth of the \$835 annual premium. I strongly encourage every River Bend resident who is in or close to the SFHA to consider purchasing flood insurance. Flood insurance typically does not go into effect until 30 days after it is purchased. If you wait until a tropical storm or hurricane is projected to impact River Bend, like Idalia recently was, it may be too late.

### **WRD/PW REPORT**

Our Public Works staff worked diligently through the month to continue their ongoing task of trimming limbs at intersections. This effort aims to enhance visibility, and safety for all road users. Public works also cleaned out several stormwater catch basins. We do this regularly to ensure effective drainage throughout the stormwater system. This proactive approach keeps the storm drainage system working properly during heavy rain events.

We had one water main break on Norbury Drive this month. A Metronet contractor caused this break during the installation of their cable piping. Our dedicated staff promptly got the water shut off to prevent damage to the roadway, and the pipe repaired. Notices were given to those affected, and the required bacteriological sample was taken. This sample came back negative for contamination. I would like to thank all of the staff for a job well done. We did have one lift station pump to burn up. It was also quickly identified, and a backup pump installed. The original pump has been rebuilt by our staff and reinstalled back into the lift station.

After-Hours water and sewer emergencies can be reported by dialing the Town Hall at 638-3870. You will be instructed to dial “9” and follow the directions to contact the on call duty operator. You will then be asked to enter your phone number at the sound of the tone. After entering your phone number, the automated system will inform you that your page has been sent. Please be patient and our utility systems operator will return your call. If you do not receive a call back within ten minutes, please notify the Police Department at 638-1108, and they will get in contact with the on-call utility systems operator.
