

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

- The combination of **SNOW**, **COLD**, and **WIND** will lead to **LIFE THREATENING** conditions outside.



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
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Threat Levels/Timing - Max Values

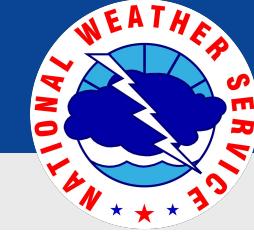
Key Messages

- Continue to monitor future updates and do not anchor on one forecast!



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


Forecast Snow Totals Through Sunday

! Localized Banding May Produce Higher Amounts



- **Snowfall rates may exceed 1"- 2"+ an hour** during the peak of the storm **Saturday Night through Sunday morning.** **Whiteout conditions expected.**
- **Blowing and drifting snow is likely, particularly in open areas and where there is exposure to north winds. Very poor visibility will result.**
- **Travel may be treacherous and potentially life-threatening.**



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


Reasonable Worst Case

January 30, 2026

3:00 PM EST

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- A band of heavy snow is likely to setup in Eastern NC
- This axis of heavier snow is likely to be adjusted and could be potentially be ANYWHERE over Eastern NC
- Blizzard conditions POSSIBLE over Outer Banks, Downeast, and open areas of the Albemarle-Pamlico Peninsula.



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

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Potential To Be Stranded On Roads

January 30, 2026
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- Cell phone charger
- First-aid kit
- Blanket
- Flashlight
- Rags or paper towels
- Jumper cables
- Water and snacks for everyone, including pets
- Traction aid: sand, salt or cat litter
- Tarp, raincoat and gloves
- Shovel



ReadyNC

- Deep snow may strand anybody that travels.
- Potential for snow covered roads for the majority of next week.
- Exposure to cold is one of the biggest killers in winter storms.

Cold Impacts: *Vulnerable Populations*

NEWBORNS **ELDERLY** **CHRONIC ILLNESS** **OUTDOOR WORKERS** **UNHOUSED**

Everyone is at risk from the dangers of extreme cold, but these groups are more vulnerable than most. Age and certain conditions make the body less able to regulate temperature.

Dress in loose layers and cover all exposed skin

Limit or avoid time outdoors

Consume hot foods and warm drinks, but avoid caffeine and alcohol

Check on family, friends and neighbors

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


Forecast Wind Gusts

January 30, 2026

Peak Gusts Saturday Night Into Sunday Morning



- Peak Wind Gusts:
 - Outer Banks: **55-70+ mph**
 - Rest Of Eastern NC: **40-55 mph**
 - **Sat night - Sun Morning**
- Impacts:
 - **Scattered power outages and tree damage on the Outer Banks**
 - **Blowing and drifting snow will make travel extremely dangerous**



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
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Coastal Flooding Expected

January 30, 2026

- Moderate to locally significant impacts expected
- Oceanside: Combination of high water levels, above normal tides, and wave run up, will lead to 2-4 ft of inundation around high tide
(Sunday AM high tide the highest)
- Soundside: Greatest impacts expected across Hatteras Island early Sunday morning
- **Travel impacts likely along vulnerable sections of NC-12, south of Oregon Inlet**



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
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Coastal Flooding Expected

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- Moderate to locally significant impacts are likely soundside along Ocracoke and Downeast Carteret
- 2-4 ft of inundation (above ground level) expected Saturday night into Sunday morning
- Minor flooding impacts expected adjacent to the lower Neuse River below New Bern
- 1-2 ft of inundation (above ground level), due to strong NE winds

SHOVEL SMART!



Shoveling heavy, wet snow can cause back injuries and heart attacks. Don't push yourself!




